

**VETERINARY SCHOLARS PROGRAM
APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS**

Application materials must be submitted by May 1 to the Student Services Office of the School of Veterinary Medicine. **The following items are necessary in order for your application to be considered complete:**

- ___ Personal information form
- ___ Experiential/awards/extracurricular form
- ___ Personal statement
- ___ High school transcript (must have seven semesters of completed coursework)
- ___ SAT and/or ACT test scores
- ___ Reference forms from veterinarians (minimum of two)

Your application will not be accepted unless you certify the accuracy of the information included on all sections of the application by your signature at the bottom of the Personal Information form.

(Purdue is an equal access/equal opportunity university. No qualified person will be denied admission on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, age, national origin, handicap status or as a disabled Vietnam era veteran.)

TIPS FOR COMPLETING THE APPLICATION

- Approach the process as you would approach preparing and submitting a resume for employment. Based upon your written record alone, you initially have to convince an individual or a group of individuals that you are unique among your competition and deserve a further look.
- Read carefully. Follow all directions. Complete all forms in their entirety. Take time to make your application legible.
- Submit information by the deadlines. Deadlines are established as an ending point for one process and a beginning point for another. Lack of attention to deadlines is a reflection on you, the applicant.
- Make sure your application is complete and submit it before the May 1st deadline; incomplete applications will not be considered.
