## ACADEMIC REGULATIONS GOVERNING "END-OF-SEMESTER" EXAMINATIONS

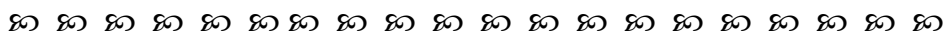
*The academic regulations governing "end-of-semester" examinations and activities are as follows:*

The final examination period is intended for the end-of-semester examination. *No examination or quiz may be given during the week (three days in summer session) preceding the final examination period of the semester (examinations for laboratory, intensive, or mini-courses excluded).* It will be the responsibility of the department head, or where appropriate the school head, to ensure that none of the departmental or school faculty uses the week (three days in summer session) preceding the final examination period to administer an examination.

Students scheduled for more than two [final] examinations in one calendar day are entitled to reschedule any examinations in excess of two. Similarly, the students faced with a direct exam conflict are entitled to reschedule either examination. *It is the responsibility of the student to make the necessary arrangements [with the instructor for rescheduling his/her individual examination] before the last week of regularly scheduled classes.* Course instructors shall not penalize a student who chooses to reschedule an examination under these options.

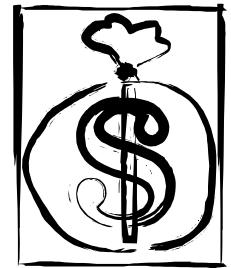

*We want to test as many cats for Feline Heartworm Antibody as we can, so please bring in cat serum or plasma samples if possible, even if they are currently on heartworm preventives.*

Test your own dog's or cat's blood (*limit two personal pets*)

Test your heartworm knowledge

Free Revolution™ script (*maximum of two personal pets*) for a year's supply provided dogs test antigen negative and have been on a heartworm preventive within the past 6 months.

Microfilaria tests will be required for any dogs that have been off preventive for at least 6 months.

**Heartworm Day has evolved into an educational afternoon for students, staff and faculty sponsored by corporate friends of the SVM. In past years, several hundred SVM individuals have benefited from the educational topics on heartworm disease, including detection, treatment and most importantly, prevention. This program is an opportunity for members of the SVM to learn more about heartworm disease in pets.**

## Heartworm Awareness Day with Pfizer (Continued)

To participate this year you must:

Have had your personal pet into the Purdue VTH for a physical exam and health care within the past year (since March 2000). Wellness exams are advised annually for dogs and cats under age 4 and semiannually for dogs and cats over age 4-6 years old depending on body size. If you are overdue for your annual or semiannual exam, you must arrange this prior to Wednesday, March 28. ***Prescription drugs cannot be dispensed without a valid doctor/patient relationship and this necessitates an annual exam at the minimum.***

Obtain a serum or plasma sample from your two pets prior to Wednesday, March 28. Blood collection materials are available outside Small Animal Surgery. If you draw blood from your pets at home, ***samples will need to be spun down within 3 hours to prevent hemolysis***, which can cause false positive results. Contact technicians from any of the Small Animal services (Community Practice, Surgery, Medicine, Ophtho, Onco) if you need assistance getting blood in the hospital. Clin Path is providing a centrifuge that people can use to spin down their pet's blood sample. The centrifuge will be in the Vet Tech Teaching Laboratory (G571). Instructions will be provided for using the centrifuge. **IT IS IMPORTANT TO FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS TO AVOID DAMAGING THE CENTRIFUGE!** If you have questions about the instructions, please see the Clinical Pathology staff in the adjoining room. If you turn your sample in to Clin Path, they will be happy to have your serum or plasma frozen and saved in a Parasitology freezer. Include your name, pet's name and HW day on the tube. They will be even happier if you do it prior to March 23, rather than waiting until the final day rush.

Young puppies under 6 months and kittens under 8 months of age will not need to be tested.

New to this year, you must be personally present at Heartworm Day to run your own tests and fill out your own scripts. You will need 6 patient stickers for Heartworm Day for each pet. Special client label stickers will be printed out on Heartworm Day at the wet lab. These will confirm a Purdue patient visit/previous medical record within the past year. When you get your script signed by a veterinarian, you will be asked to sign a statement indicating that these are your own personal pets and not those of friends, relatives, extended family, classmates, neighbors, etc. This program is intended as an educational and promotional program to expose you to these tests and prescription products and is limited to two personal pets for members of the SVM family.

**PHARMACY WILL ONLY HONOR HEARTWORM AWARENESS DAY PRESCRIPTIONS THIS ONE DAY!** They will be open extended hours (until 6:00 pm) to fill your prescriptions.
