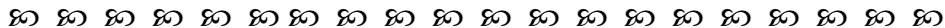

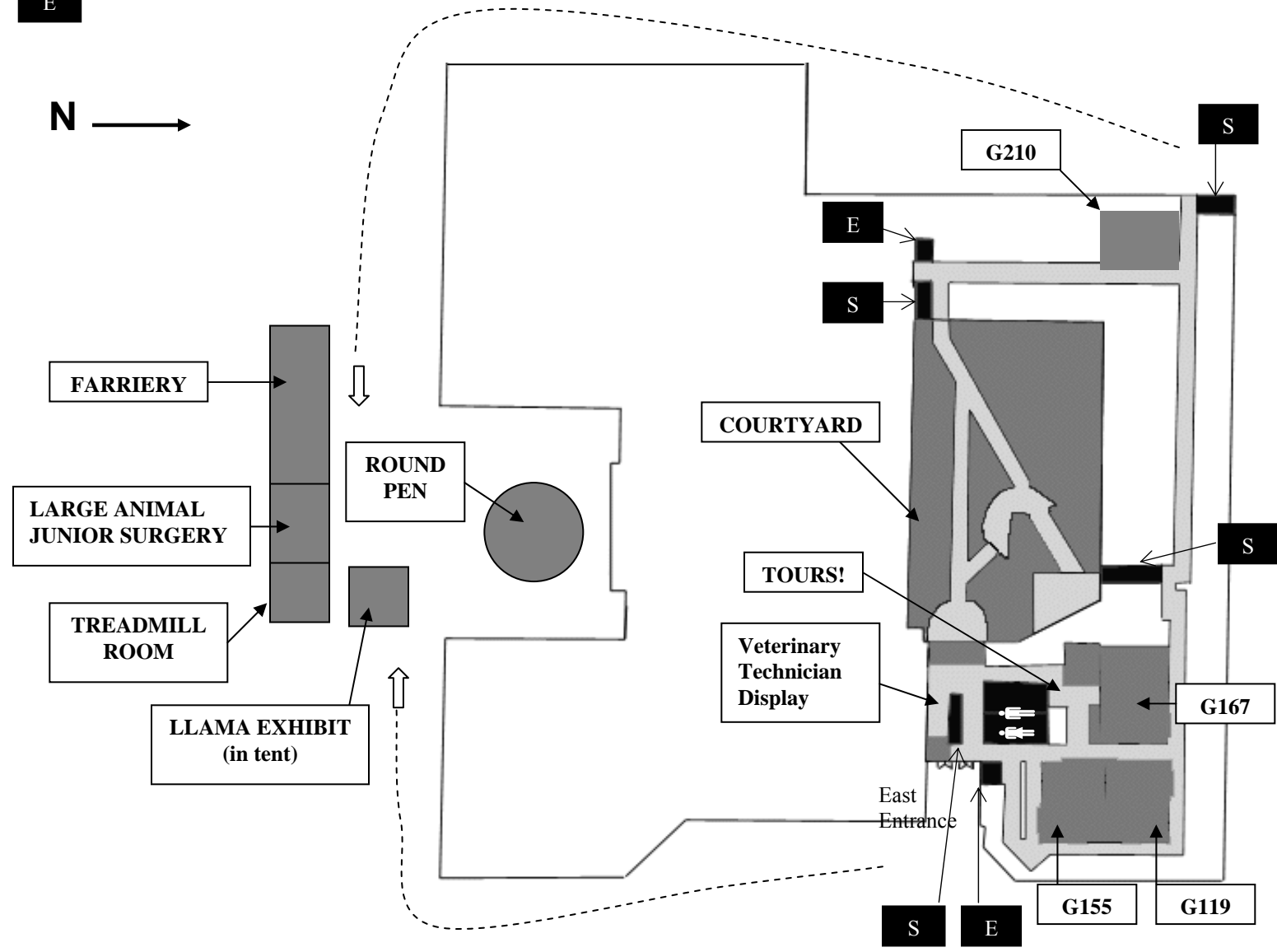

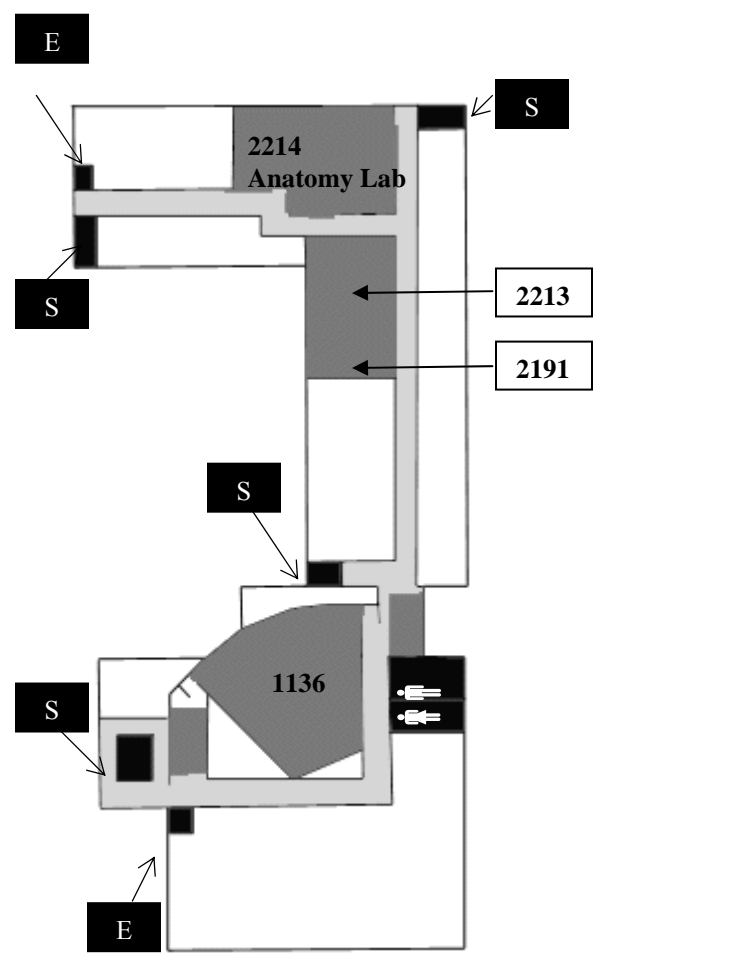

E =Elevator

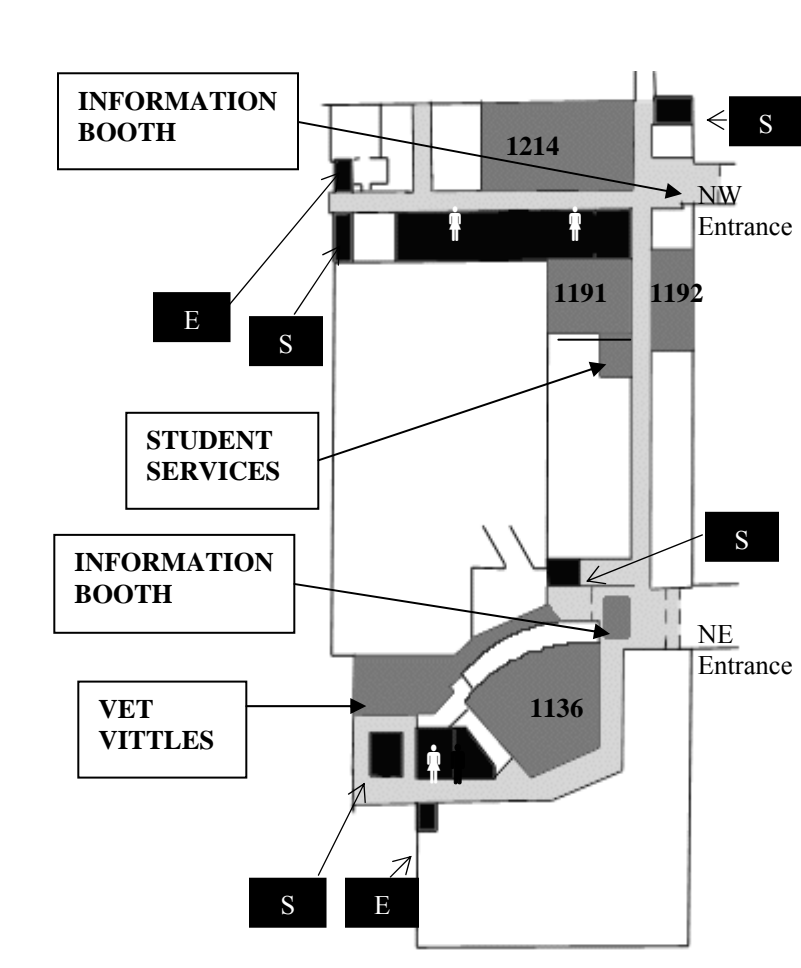
