

**Purdue University School of Veterinary Medicine  
Summer Research Program for Undergraduate Students**

The Purdue University School of Veterinary Medicine (PVM), is pleased to announce the availability of summer research opportunities for undergraduate students interested in veterinary medicine and biomedical research.

The objective of this program is to provide an opportunity for undergraduate students to experience biomedical research. Up to six undergraduate students will be selected to participate in a twelve-week research project during the summer of 2012. The students who are selected will be paired with a faculty mentor in the PVM who will work with them to design and conduct a research project on a topic related to their research in veterinary and/or comparative medicine. At the end of the summer, the students will be expected to submit a written report and participate in a poster session highlighting their research. Each student awarded a fellowship will receive a stipend of \$3,000 for twelve weeks of work and a travel/accommodation allowance of \$1,000.

These fellowships are open to undergraduate students. Non-Purdue students are welcome to apply. Applicants may indicate preference for research in any of the following areas: infectious diseases, cancer, neuroscience, tissue engineering and clinical research. However, selection of the research project will depend in part on availability.

Applications are to be made to Dr. HogenEsch by Friday, February 3, 2012. (See below for application procedures.) Selected students will be notified by February 27, and will be matched with faculty mentors by April 2, 2012.

**Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship Awards  
Application Procedures**

1. Essay (no more than 2 pages, double-spaced) summarizing your career goals, motivation for application, and statement of how participation in this program will help you attain your goals.
2. List the area(s) of your primary interest for summer study. Give reasons for this choice.
3. Summary of your previous research laboratory experience (if any).
4. A resume.
5. A copy of your undergraduate transcripts.
