2019 ANNUAL REPORT

Two thousand nineteen held significant changes for the Indiana ADDL, including the appointment of a new leadership team, with myself as Director and Dr. Craig Bowen as Assistant Director (https://www.purdue.edu/vet/news/new-addl-director.php). Three retirements were announced: Dr. Steve Lenz (pathologist), Dr. Pat Wakenell (avian pathologist) and Donna Schrader (avian serology technician). Dr. Geoff Lossie joined the ADDL as the avian diagnostician, and the serology section was restructured to incorporate avian serology tests. The AAVLD audit team visited the ADDL in May to conduct a five year audit, and in August the ADDL received notification of full accreditation. Strategic fee changes were implemented to reflect the rising cost of quality diagnostics.

Facts and figures contained in this report reflect the service provided to our veterinary partners in Indiana and beyond. Thank you for your trust and support as we work together to promote animal health.


Serology staff received the BRAVO award for their efforts to meet the testing needs of the poultry industry.



Accessions by Species (West Lafayette & Heeke)








