What is this program?

The **Vet Up! College** program is a six-week-long residential summer program at the Purdue University College of Veterinary Medicine. The

program will prepare students from underserved communities and career interests for competitive entry into the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) pool.



Application Deadline: February 3, 2020, 11:59 EST

Program participants will,

- Experience the curriculum life of a DVM student, with cultural competence training
- Receive mentorship from PVM faculty, staff, and students
- Gain hands-on animal experience and exposure to veterinary careers
- Earn a \$60 stipend each day for six weeks
- Be provided with apartment housing
- Receive travel reimbursement support
- Be invited to interview for Purdue University's College of Veterinary Medicine Early Admission process if a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA is earned prior to program application submission

- Completed application submitted by 11:59 EST, February 3, 2020
- Two letters of Recommendation with Evaluation forms
- Official Transcripts
- Commit to living in West Lafayette, Indiana for Vet Up! College sessions for 6
 weeks
- Commit to living on campus for the duration of the program
- Commit to conducting oneself in a collegial and professional manner per PVM values

Eligibility

- Meets Vet Up! The National HCOP Academy for Veterinary Medicine Program Eligibility Requirements
- Enrolled in college as an undergraduate student
- Demonstrates career interest in a veterinary shortage area
- Demonstrates equity-mindedness
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5/4.0
